#### Ministry message

This month the ministry message is linked to our eco-church activities.


The Nation's Climate Sunday service was held on the 5th September, but churches can hold their own service at any date up to the 1st November. The timing is deliberate because the UN Climate Conference, COP26, begins on 1st November in Glasgow. Our Team Service will address the issues on the last Sunday in October.

It's obvious from news reports and weather forecasts that climate change does exist with the evidence being the increased frequency of extreme weather events and related disasters.

The Climate Sunday initiative calls on all local churches in the UK to hold a service and encourage us as the congregation to make a commitment to take more action to address climate change in our church and community. As well as practical action we need to let our politicians know that plans made during COP26 should help deliver a cleaner, greener and fairer future.

In effect we need to be better stewards of planet earth.

In biology students are taught about the sigmoid growth curve that illustrates how the population of microbes changes over time. They are in a test tube with a finite amount of space and food for the population. We are on a planet that has similar constraints.



In the lag phase the population remains constant even though there are more resources than needed.

Then in the exponential growth phase the population explodes as the organisms make the most of the available resources. There is still plenty to go round.

The plateau phase is an equilibrium where birth, death and resources are balanced and the population remains constant.

Finally comes the self explanatory death phase. Resources are depleted, space for growth is restricted and the death rate far exceeds the formation of new microbes. The population plummets as it cannot be supported by the available resources.

This is why we need to be better stewards of planet earth to ensure we can maintain the equilibrium between resources and demands that the population makes.

If we reduce the amount of CO<sub>2</sub> we produce we can reduce the rate of the temperature increase, but it's so much more than that alone. We need to actively remove CO<sub>2</sub> as well through replanting rather than deforestation. We need to move away from fossil fuels which took millions of years to form in the earth but only a few hundred years for us to use up.

If you want key information about climate change then BBC iPlayer will provide access to the BBC documentary with Sir David Attenborough *Climate Change—The Facts*.

We may be considerably more complex than microbes but all living things require food, water and space/ shelter. If the 'death' phase doesn't convince you that we need to rethink our behaviour to ensure the earth thrives for everyone then remember that one of the best survivors on the planet is the cockroach. They can apparently survive being gassed with cyanide. Do we want our legacy to be 'the planet of the cockroaches'?

#### WALK BESIDE US - A prayer for the care of creation

#### St Albans Cathedral's black Jesus is a 'bold statement'

The Last Supper showing a black Jesus has been installed in a cathedral in what campaigners described as a "bold statement". St Albans for Black Lives Matter said the cathedral's use of the print had "brought about a countywide conversation".


The print has been placed at the Altar of the Persecuted in the North Transept of St Albans Cathedral. The church said it was in "support of the Black Lives Matter (BLM) movement". The original artwork, painted in 2010, had previously been shot while on display at a church in Gloucestershire.

The artist used a Jamaican-born model for the basis of her interpretation of Leonardo da Vinci's 15th Century work, and said she wanted "to make people question the Western myth that [Jesus Christ] had fair hair and blue eyes". The Very Reverend Dr Jeffrey John, dean of the cathedral, said: "Our faith teaches that we are all made equally in the image of God, and that God is a God of justice."

The cathedral said the 8ft 8in-high (2.6m) picture was part of a prayer installation to mark its reopening, and called on people to "look with fresh eyes at something you think you know".

In a statement, the cathedral said: "We stand with the Black Lives Matter movement to be allies for change, building a strong, just and fair community where the dignity of every human being is honoured and celebrated, where black voices are heard, and where black lives matter." The installation has provoked debate on the cathedral's Facebook page, with one poster saying: "Why do we have to be all about colour? If Jesus was from Jerusalem he would've probably looked darker, but he taught us to love everyone, that's my belief anyway." Others had a different view, with another poster saying: "I think this is a very welcome initiative.

Thank you for it - it is needed."

## **NOTABLE CHURCHES:** ARTICLES WANTED!


Whilst travelling around on holiday or perhaps funerals or weddings, I have often been impressed by interesting churches. And so, I have often included articles on those churches.

#### Working with the children and young people in the parish

Would you like to work with the children and young people in our parish? As a parish we are able to offer a variety of activities for children and young people from birth to 21 years old. These take place 6 days a week (in term time) and are held at both churches. We rely on volunteers to run the groups each week. All volunteers need to obtain a DBS Disclosure and attend a parish SAFEGUARDING course at least once every 5 years. Here in Halewood we are very fortunate that we have 92 people who have completed our SAFEGUARDING procedures and have been authorised by HCC to work with the children and young people. However, there is always a need for more leaders and helpers for all of our groups. If you are inter-

ested in becoming a leader/helper at any of our groups, or you are already involved with a group but would like to become involved with another group, then please speak to Gill McIver (U18's Co-ordinator).

If you would like more information about any of the groups, there are folders containing leaflets about each one. There is a folder at each church and also one at St Nicholas' Centre. Please ask the Wardens, Stewards or the Sides people, or speak to Gill McIver. Thank you.




#### Natasia needs some new Jam Club leaders

#### Important Information about Church Re-opening

#### Halewood

Following the government announcement lifting social distancing guidelines, we will start our re-opening process at St. Mary's and St. Nicholas' from September 5th, when people will be free to come to church without booking beforehand.

We are aware that the lifting of restrictions will not be happy news for everyone. Some of you will be feeling anxious about gathering again. We want to look after each other and help everyone to feel comfortable in attending church, and so the following safety measures will be in place:

- we strongly advise that everyone continues to wear a mask unless you have a medical exemption
- hand sanitiser will still be available at the door.
- we encourage people to sit with an empty seat between their family/bubble and the next person/group, and avoid shaking hands etc.
- Services will continue to be short and people are encouraged to catch up with each other outside, to limit the amount of time we are gathered together inside
- for track and trace we will still have a QR code by the door, and those who wish to leave their details can do so, although it will not be compulsory.

Please be thoughtful about how you interact with other people and respect the person on the receiving end - some may still want to keep a good distance and that's okay!

Services will take place as follows:

Sunday 10:30am St. Mary's

Sunday 10:30am and 6:30pm St. Nicholas'

Wednesday 8pm Zoom

Thursday 9:15am St. Nicholas'

The Zoom service on Sunday will be suspended at the end of August. We know this will be a disappointment for some people, but we are hoping to install wifi in St. Nicholas' as soon as possible so that we can offer a Zoom service for those unable to attend in the future and will keep you posted about that.

Thank you for your patience as we work out how we slowly roll out through this transition time and reintroduce a more normal service as safely as we can. Please pray for us as the team works out the safest way to administer communion in the future and how and when we can restart our creche and Sunday School.

#### St. Hilda's

At St Hilda's we will continue with the careful reopening of the Church. We will broadly remain the same as we have been, but with the option of allowing a few more people in, without compromising social distancing. So we will have quiet singing behind masks and allow up to 40 people in the service, not including welcomers and leaders. We will continue to ask people to use hand gel, and for people to wear masks, except for those who are exempt.






