

MINISTRY MESSAGE

Real Transformation

I'm nearly 40, and I think my algorithms are trying to tell me something. The books suggested to me are about building good habits and breaking bad ones. The podcasts urge early-morning runs and eating more kefir and kimchi — and other things I've never even heard of. The adverts promise a new me: fitter, sharper, more productive. It sounds good! Finding ways to improve our health, fitness and wellbeing is good and helpful.

We're currently in the season of Lent — the time in the church year when many of us undertake a kind of spiritual MOT and try to honestly examine ourselves. Many of us will give something up, or try to grow in prayer or another spiritual discipline, such as fasting, in order to draw closer to God.

But there is a danger here. It's easy to turn Lent into yet another self-improvement project. Lent invites us deeper than that. The Christian faith has always recognised that human beings are beyond mere self-improvement. A little tinkering around the edges is not enough. Our habits, hurts and hang-ups — our tendency to make a mess of things (sin, in other words) — run deep. If you've been human for very long, you probably know this well.

That can sound pessimistic, and it can be off-putting to those considering the Christian faith. For me, though, I find it both deeply realistic and profoundly hopeful. Realistic, because it names the problem. Hopeful, because the problem is not the final word.

Jesus says, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23). The shape of the Christian life is not a bit of life DIY, but something far more radical: dying and rising. Dying to all that distorts and defaces the life of God within us, so that we might become fully alive in Christ.

One of my favourite pictures of this comes from C.S. Lewis's *The Voyage of the Dawn Treader*. In the story, we meet Eustace, who is initially rather selfish and unpleasant. He becomes a dragon — an outward sign of what he has been inwardly. Miserable, he tries to scratch off his dragon skin. He peels away one layer, then another — but it's never enough. In the end, Aslan must sink his claws in and tear it off himself. It hurts, but this time the change is real.

It's a wonderful picture of one of the great truths of the gospel: we can change — because we can be changed. "If anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come" (2 Corinthians 5:17). We do not have to be defined by the sins, habits and wounds of our past. Change and healing are possible.

For some, that journey may include professional medical or psychological support. Seeking help can be a deeply Christian step. God's grace, let us not forget, often works through skilled hands as well as through prayer.

Twelve Step movements, known to many through groups like Alcoholics Anonymous, recognise that we cannot fix ourselves by willpower and self-improvement alone. We need help from outside ourselves. We need honesty. We need grace.

James, our curate, is planning to run a Celebrate Recovery course — a Christ-centred 12-step programme — which can bring freedom not only from addictions of various kinds, but also from other negative habits and destructive patterns. Do keep an eye out for the dates, or speak to one of the clergy if you're interested.

My prayer for us this Lent, as we move towards Easter, is not simply that we would tweak a few habits, but that we would allow God to go deeper. That we would open ourselves to his gentle — and sometimes painful — work of removing the scales that cling so tightly. And that through Jesus' life, death and resurrection, and the work of the Spirit, we may find ourselves "transformed into his image with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit" (2 Corinthians 3:18).

PARISH WALK - Sefton and Greenbank Parks and Sudley House



The 21st of February started dry and bright, which made a refreshing change from the recent rain. The group setting off from the St Nicholas Centre, all well prepared for whatever the day might bring, was seventeen strong.

After a pre-walk refreshment stop in Dobbies, we drove to Sefton Park. The park was busy with people of all ages enjoying the sunshine.

We walked past areas of grass carpeted with snowdrops and crocus which were attracting the odd early bumble bee. A welcome sight indeed, making us believe that spring is just around the corner.



After circling the lake, which has a diverse population of bird life, we headed toward Greenbank Park. A smaller, but no less popular, park - we counted our blessings in having such lovely open spaces on our doorstep.

Heading away from here towards Queens Drive we passed the end of Penny Lane, where a large group of Beatles fans were having their pictures taken by the street signs; a popular stop on "The Magical Mystery Tour".



We continued along North Mossley Hill Road towards Rose Lane, passing the remains of Carnatic University Halls, which are in the process of being flattened to make room for a new housing development.

My husband, Richard, has fond memories of his first year in Liverpool in 1980 when he lived at these halls.

We soon arrived at Sudley House and were greeted with more crocus lawns. The house has an attractive veranda which makes an excellent place for a stop and a snack. It overlooks the rose garden and Hillsborough Memorial, as well as the rugby ground.

There was a match taking place, which added interest for some of our party. There are also good views of the river and Welsh Hills.

After lunch, the group split for half an hour. Some chose to look around the house itself, whilst the rest of the group walked along the woodland path on the edge of the rather soggy field.

The rain started as we set off back to Sefton Park. It was not particularly heavy but rather, in the words of Peter Kaye, "the sort of rain that gets you wet".

Back at the cars we said our goodbyes and set off for home.



Sudley House, built in 1824 in Mossley Hill, was the family home of Liverpool merchant George Holt and remains one of the few Victorian merchant houses to survive largely intact. George was an avid art collector, acquiring works by leading British painters, including Millais, Turner, Gainsborough and Reynolds. After George's death in 1896, his daughter Emma continued to live in the house and became known for her philanthropic work, particularly her support for women's welfare and education in Liverpool. When she died in 1944, she bequeathed the house and her father's art collection to the city, ensuring its preservation for future generations.

Register Today for the Triangle of Hope Youth Pilgrimage to Ghana

In August 2026 a group of young people from across Liverpool Diocese will be travelling to Ghana to join other young people from Kumasi Diocese and Virginia Diocese for an week long pilgrimage. This is open to anyone who will be at least 14 on 2nd August 2026.


Pilgrims are expected to fundraise £750 towards the trip which is supported by The Triangle of Hope, Diocese of Liverpool, USPG and others. They also need to acquire a VISA, travel insurance, anti-malarial medication and a yellow fever vaccination (total cost approx. £200). The Diocese of Liverpool will be able to help you with all of this if you are granted a place.

There will likely be many more applicants than spaces so please get in touch as soon as possible. There is no application form at this stage – we need a letter addressed to Canon Mal Rogers and sent to Malcolm.rogers@liverpool.anglican.org telling us a little bit about yourself and why you would like to be part of the pilgrimage.
